SU Trustee Board, Affiliations, and Finances Update, and questions	Martin Dodd, Deputy CEO – Membership	<p>Overview provided of SU finances, highlighting trend in increase of income and expenditures. <p>Idea Submission 'Gender Affirming Care Fund'</p>	<p>Minna Ellis, CSM Officer</p>	<p>Idea Presentation: Minna shared that she proposed this idea on behalf of a former UAL student. Minna provided an overview of the idea, based on research of funds at other universities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fund for students per academic year • Up to £100 per students for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Money for their own transitions ○ Gender affirming underwear and binders ○ Wigs, make up, and clothing ○ Travel money to get to gender identity clinics ○ Non-means tested, available for all students <p>Minna suggested that UCL's model may be good to follow, as a similarly sized University with a fund already in place.</p> <p>Minna shared that in the future, she would like to pass off this project onto a trans student or students to better represent the issue.</p> <p>Discussion: A student advocated for the name 'Gender Expression Fund' as opposed to 'Gender Affirmation Fund' to make it clear that the University can't provide healthcare. Minna shared that the name could be changed in the future.</p> <p>Vote: Yes: 13 No: 2 Abstain: 0</p> <p>Result: The idea passes.</p>
<p>Idea Submission 'Petition for full-time students to be able to claim means-tested benefits'</p>	<p>Sophia Nasif-Whitestone, LCC Officer</p>	<p>Idea Presentation: Sophia provided an overview of the idea for full-time students to be able to claim means-tested benefits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Should be a review for student eligibility for benefits that is based on circumstances. • Students should no longer have their loans counted towards their means-testing. • Arts SU to lobby for this change to be made government policy. <p>Discussion: No questions or comments were made.</p> <p>Vote: Yes: 16 No: 0 Abstain: 0</p> <p>Results: The idea passes.</p>
